

11 Things that Anyone Can Do to Prevent Elder Abuse

Learn the signs of elder abuse and neglect



- 2 Call or visit an elderly loved one and ask how he or she is doing
- Provide a respite break for a caregiver



- Ask your bank manager to train tellers on how to detect elder financial abuse
- Ask your doctor to ask you and all other senior patients about possible family violence in their lives



6 Contact your local Adult Protective Services or Long-Term Care Ombudsman to learn how to support their work helping at-risk elders and adults with disabilities

- 7 Organize a "Respect Your Elders" essay or poster contest in your child's school
- Ask your religious congregration's leader to give a talk about elder abuse at a service or to put a message about elder abuse in the bulletin
- 9 **Volunteer to be a friendly visitor** to a nursing home resident or to a homebound senior in your neighborhood
- Send a letter to your local paper, radio or TV station suggesting that they cover World Elder Abuse
 Awareness Day (June 15) or Grandparents Day in September



11 Dedicate your bikeathon/marathon/ other event to elder mistreatment awareness and prevention



Call the Elder Abuse Hotline at (216) 420-6700 24/7, including holidays. DSAS is the mandated provider of adult protective services in Cuyahoga County. The intent of the adult protective services is to protect and assist adults 60+ who may be victims of abuse, neglect, self-neglect and/or financial exploitation. APS is mandated by the Ohio Revised Code (Section 5101.60 and 5101.71).
